Trusting God's Wisdom And Making Wise Choices

Proverbs 3:1-6

Sometimes we find life loud and confusing while trying to figure out a multitude of things - work, school, life, purpose and our faith. It is like driving in the dark without a map, GPS system, and your phone is at 3%, but God says trust him.

Solomon gives legacy level wisdom in this proverb, passing from father to son. He says put the commands in your heart and trust God's timing. The Hebrew definition of heart is not just emotions, but it includes your life, mind and will.

Solomon's advice is to not lean on external forces - luck, life hacks and vibes, but lean on God's wisdom which does not fade, but stands eternal. God has no desire to be your backup plan. He desires your whole heart- every part of you, but you can't have a microwave faith. You have to submit to the process and let him develop you.

We know that trust is hard, whether we break our own or someone else does. But we have the assurance that God does not lie. If he promises he fulfils. He never changes; he is the same yesterday, today, and tomorrow. He is steady, reliable and consistent.

Always acknowledge him and live according to his will. Allow him to be at the wheel, and he will direct your path. He will open doors, shut down distractions, and block relationships. Sometimes the silence will feel louder than the noise, and you need Jesus because friends and family will fail you. They don't have the answer and you don't have it. Only God has it because he is the

answer. God trusted the Father even though it meant going to the cross, but the cross became our victory. There is victory in Jesus. Choose his Godly wisdom.
